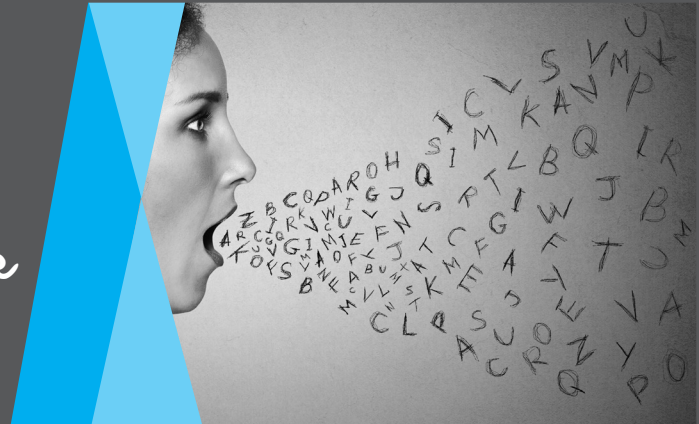


Yesterday, Today and Tomorrow: Investigating Language Change in Bermuda and Beyond
